Extension: Jan. 18-June 30, 2026



"We've found him. He's OK!"




These past months have been a season of **significant growth**, and I am grateful for the prayers and encouragement that have supported me throughout this journey.





Serving aboard the *Logos Hope* has placed me at the heart of its mission to bring knowledge, help and hope to communities around the world. A central part of my service has been within the **book fair ministry**, which is one of the primary ways the ship engages with visitors.

In this role, I am **responsible** for creating a welcoming and meaningful experience for everyone who comes aboard. This involves more than guiding people through the book fair—it requires listening carefully to their needs, offering guidance, and engaging in purposeful conversations that encourage, inspire, and provide support. Through these interactions, I have learned to communicate thoughtfully, respond with empathy, and foster genuine connections with people from diverse backgrounds.







One of the most important ways I have grown during this time is in becoming bolder and more confident when engaging with strangers.

I have learned that meaningful connection often begins with simply stepping forward and showing genuine interest. Many conversations in the book fair start around books but develop into opportunities to encourage, uplift, and offer guidance.

This growth has not only helped me in my ministry but has also shaped how I interact with others in all areas of life.

During my time on board, I have also served in several ports across the Caribbean, including the Bahamas, the British Virgin Islands, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Antigua and Barbuda, Grenada, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Tobago, and currently Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago, where we have been docked since January 3rd. **Each port has brought unique opportunities to engage with local communities and see the tangible impact of the ship's ministry.**





One of the most impactful outreach experiences I participated in took place in Grenada, where I was part of a team that visited a maximum-security prison. Our role was to assist in testing inmates for eyeglasses and distributing them to those in need. Being in that environment was humbling and challenged many of my assumptions. **It was powerful to see how something as practical as proper vision could restore dignity, confidence, and comfort** to individuals who are often overlooked. This experience reminded me that service is not only about words, but about meeting real, tangible needs with compassion and respect.

I also had the opportunity to be part of an **outreach team that visited a school in Antigua**. During this visit, we engaged with students and supported the school through educational and relational activities. **Spending time in the school setting highlighted the importance of investing in young people and encouraging a love for learning**. It was meaningful to be able to support students in a practical way and to see the impact that presence, encouragement, and education can have in shaping lives and futures.

Life aboard the ship is structured and demanding, requiring discipline, teamwork, and adaptability. The routine of long workdays and close community living has strengthened my character, perseverance, and reliance on God. Being part of a Christ-centred community has deepened my faith and given me a clearer understanding of what it means to serve faithfully.





Extension

After prayer and reflection, I have decided to **extend my time aboard the *Logos Hope***. I have grown to deeply love the work I am doing and the mission I am part of. More importantly, I feel that **God is still shaping me and using this season to work through me**. Extending allows me to continue serving, learning, and being available for the ways He chooses to use me.
